TIPS FROM THE PRO

For the last two months I've talked about the Fundamentals of the Swing and how the Fundamentals are the same for all Golfers. This month I want to talk about a Second Truth In Golf, which is "The Short Game Is the Key to Success".

The Short Game is what separates the Struggling Hacker from the Polished Professional. The average 18 hole golf course plays to a par of 70 to 72 strokes. Should you putt twice on each of the eighteen holes then you would have taken 36 of your 70 to 72 strokes. If you then add the approach shot to each green you have added another 18 strokes, to a sub-total of 54 of the 70 to 72 strokes. These figures emphasize the importance of the Short Game. The First Step In Developing an Effective Short Game, can only be found In Repetition. Practice is the key word in this development. To begin you Development, you must begin from the End. An Effective Short Game must begin from Short Putts. The initial focus must be upon the Motion of the Putter and the Location of the Ball at the Point of Impact. These are the Two Secrets we will reveal this month. The Putter Head must move in equal Motion in Both directions, away from and through the ball. The Speed of the Take-Away should Equal the Speed of the Motion through Impact. The Putter Head should continue its Motion beyond the point of Impact and continue its Square and Parallel position until the Putter is "in the Hole". The Ball must be placed in such a position the Putter Head makes its initial Impact on the Upswing". The Putter Head should contact the ball "Above the Midline". This action will prevent the ball from bouncing up or to the side and will insure maximum Top Spin, which will keep the Ball "Rolling Online".

These are the First Two Tips to the Short Game. The next Two Tips will come next month. So give the Tips a Try and keep Focused on your Game and Keep Focused on Tips From the Pro.
